



## PRAYING FOR THE CLERGY

On Saturday 27th June Bishop Tim will ordain 13 deacons in the Cathedral. During the week that follows he and I will ordain 10 priests in the parishes where they are serving. Ordinations are always very moving occasions as we gather to support people as they make their commitment to a ministry of service, a ministry of word and sacrament.

The ordaining bishop invokes the Holy Spirit, lays hands on each ordinand and then prays over the deacons:

"Through your Spirit, heavenly Father, give these your servants grace and power to fulfil their ministry. Make them faithful to serve and constant in advancing your gospel in the world."

And over the priests:

"Through your Spirit, heavenly Father, give these your servants grace and power to proclaim the gospel of your salvation and minister the sacraments of the new covenant."

It is an awesome responsibility to entrust to our deacons and priests. It is an awesome responsibility to be entrusted with a ministry of service. It is an awesome responsibility to be entrusted to administer the sacraments. The best clergy recognise constantly that they exercise that responsibility, not in their own strength but by the power of the Holy Spirit working in and through them.

The Church expects a lot of her clergy. Sometimes those expectations are unrealistic. However, if we are to expect the best from our clergy we can all support them in a variety of ways. Most importantly we can encourage them. Encourage them to make space and time

for the development of their own relationship with God, time for prayer, for study and for reflection. Secondly we need to remember to pray for them regularly and faithfully. Thirdly we can give them affirmation rather than criticism.

Those who begin ordained ministry at the end of this month and the beginning of the next do so, I'm sure, with a strong sense of call, with a sense of expectation, a sense of wanting to serve, feelings of joy and thanksgiving and I hope, a healthy feeling of trepidation. That sense of call, that vocation, needs to be nurtured throughout ministry and it is important for the laity to realise that they have a role in that nurturing, to help the priest to be a priest rather than just doing the things a priest does.

I was ordained deacon 33 years ago. I can honestly say as I look back over that time and reflect on some achievements and a lot of mistakes, that I would not have wanted to be or to do anything else. The Church has changed significantly during that time and patterns of ministry have changed almost beyond recognition, but the representative role of the clergy person remains to encourage and enable each of us to be what Fr John Gribben describes as sacraments of the Real Presence of Christ in our places of work, communities, places of retirement and leisure.

Please pray for all to be ordained at this time and pray too that their vocation may remain as fresh throughout their ministry as it is on their ordination day.

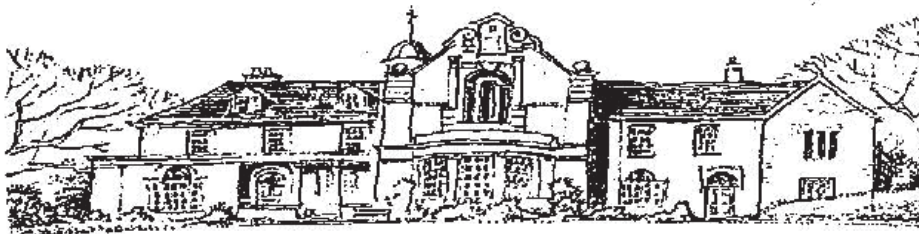

### WATER CHARGING

There has been a petition on the 10 Downing Street website asking for a review of the new water charging regime as it affected many churches and community buildings. While this method of charging had not been introduced by South West Water, it might have been in the future.

The Government have now responded to the petition, and have recognised that the increases are 'disproportionate and insensitive to the needs of water companies' customers'. United Utilities has been the water company where the increases have been most problematic and they have now taken action to reduce the impact of the change in charging regime. DEFRA and OFWAT will continue to monitor the situation.

## ROYAL SCHOOL OF CHURCH MUSIC

The Cornwall Area committee of the Royal School of Church music is preparing an exciting programme of events and activity in the coming year. The "Come and Sing Stainer's Crucifixion" held in the Cathedral on Passion Sunday was a huge success. Training is offered to anyone involved with church music and liturgy, including organists, choir-trainers, cantors, music group leaders, readers and clergy. The former RSCM Organist Training Scheme is being given a new lease of life with a new name and syllabus - further details will be available shortly.

The new examination syllabus for Bishop's and Dean's Chorister Awards in the Diocese is now available on the new website. In a recent departure from tradition, the awards can be taken by both adults and children - why not encourage singers from your church or choir to have a go? The awards are presented at the Diocesan Choral Festival held in October each year.

This year's Truro Diocesan Choral Festival takes place on Saturday 17th October in Truro Cathedral, conducted by Christopher Gray. The music has been especially chosen so that it includes something for singers of all ages and abilities, from small churches with limited musical resources to larger Parish Churches. Please make a note of the date and try to encourage singers from your church to come and take part and help to make this year's festival the biggest and best so far!

The RSCM is an educational charity dedicated to raising standards and promoting music in every style of Christian worship and every denomination. The RSCM now numbers over 11,000 members and affiliates world-wide. Members are offered support and guidance through local and national events and publications. Members are drawn from all denominations, worshipping in different ways with different styles of music. Their common belief is that Christian worship is enriched by good music, used effectively.

## FROM THE CANON THEOLOGIAN

I promised I would say more about the idea that one of the big changes which is taking place in Europe is that the 'age of Christendom' is ending, and that the partnership between Church and State which goes back to the conversion of the Emperor Constantine is as good as over. So here is something on two aspects of this.

'Establishment'. Back in the 1990s when I was Chair of the Methodist District I used to write an occasional column in the *Coracle* for Bishop Michael. I surprised some Anglicans and offended some Methodists in one by saying that I firmly believed in the establishment of the C of E. I wrote that I had said at a meeting of the Diocesan Bishops and the Methodist Chairs at Ampleforth Abbey that the Bishops should think twice before exchanging their Anglican Establishment birthright for a mess of Free Church pottage. I still believe that. But back then the pressure for disestablishment was coming from inside the Church. Now it is coming from outside.

House of Lords reform is one example. It is on the back burner now, but it will be back. There is growing feeling that the Church has no right to influence legislation like it did when the Bishops voted unanimously against the Assisted Dying bill two years ago. Attitudes are hardening and the Church will have to produce exceptionally good arguments to get any purple on to those red benches in the future.

So the question has changed. It is no longer a question of whether the Church of England should be disestablished, but of when and how.

*Parish Churches.* Last month Prof. Grace Davie from Exeter University came to our *Open to Question?* group when we were

discussing the future of the Church. She is a sociologist of religion of international standing as well as a good Anglican and an advisor to the Archbishop. One of her points really struck home. She said that our society has moved from a culture of 'obligation' to one of 'consumption', and that this affects church-going like it affects everything else. Now, like many of you, I am still one of those people who do things because we think we ought to. If I'm honest, one of the reasons I go to church on Sunday is that I think I ought to. Grace said that most people are not like that any more. They do things because they want to do them rather than because they think they ought to do them.

Parish Churches are Christendom built in granite. Inside them, though, congregations are tiny because people no longer feel they have to go to church. But, Grace said, people do use them when they need them! And think of the outcry if we try to close a church. It's like the Post Office, the school and the dentist: people expect them to be there when and if they need them. It's their right as consumers. That annoys me: but after listening to Grace I began to think that it was perhaps me who needs to have a rethink. What if I started to think about what I and my local church actually offer these potential consumers of Christianity? Or what the Bible and the Faith say we have to offer? Or what our product is? Or how best we can promote it? I don't like thinking in this consumerist way, but I have a nagging suspicion that this is how our forebears thought before 'Christendom' arrived. So might we need to think this way now that it is going?
