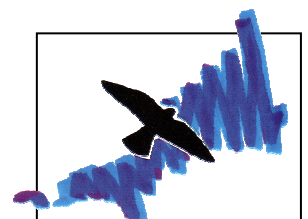




Judaism

Key Stage 2

- Worship** Distinctive features of a synagogue, both inside and outside, eg ark, bimah, etc. Symbols – star of David, menorah, tallit, kippah. Elements of worship – psalms and songs.
- Celebration** Pesach, Rosh Hashanah, Purim concentrating on themes like courage, belief in the living God, creation and making a new start.
- Authority** Place as the Rabbi as a teacher. Importance of mitzvah and the Ten Commandments. What it means to live a life under God's law. eg Shabbat rules.
- Beliefs** Belief is shown through outward signs and action, eg kosher food, kippah, tallit, observance of Shabbat.
- Symbols** Symbols connected with worship and their different levels of meaning, eg menorah, star of David, tallit.
- Lifestyles** The Ten Commandments, the Shema, the Torah – rules for living.
- Stages of Life** Ceremonies marking key stages in life in Judaism, eg circumcision – Brit Milah, Bar Mitzvah, Bat Mitzvah, wedding.



Natural World Festivals associated with the natural world, eg Rosh Hashanah, Sukkot.

Relationships Stories from the Tenakh that show the independence of human beings, eg Esther, Joseph, Ruth, etc.
