“Survivors of sexual abuse still see a need for better support and action in recognition of their pain. They continue to press the Church to provide safer communities where their experiences of abuse can be heard and support offered.”

We are thus required to appoint “carefully chosen, competent and trained people as ‘authorised listeners’ for those who disclose abuse.”

Authorised Listeners: Listening to survivors of abuse

Those who have been abused by members of the Church of England, clergy or lay employees, can be put in touch with people who can listen, help and very importantly, believe them.

WHAT WE DO

Provide an attentive and attuned listening ear to assist you in talking about experiences in relation to present or past abuse.

Assist you in considering the next steps, and support you in taking them. Next steps could include reporting abuse to a statutory agency, instigating disciplinary proceedings, seeking counselling, pastoral support or mediation.

Where appropriate, and with your agreement, enable referrals to be made to other professionals.

CONFIDENTIALITY

Client confidentiality will be protected and information will only be shared with the client's express permission.

EXCEPTIONS

Information must be shared if:

There is a risk of harm to the client and the client is deemed unable to protect themselves.

There is a risk of harm to other people (including the Authorised Listener).

Authorised Listeners: Listening to survivors of abuse

The Diocese of Truro has commissioned this service from SKOODHYA, a registered charity based in Cornwall with expertise and experience of supporting victims and survivors of sexual abuse.



WHO WE ARE

Skoodhya is a Cornish Charity offering support to people who have experienced sexual abuse. Skoodhya operates the Willow Centre, which is the Sexual Assault Referral Centre (SARC) for Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly.

The SARC provides a range of services to people who have been affected by sexual violence and abuse, whether it happened recently or in the past.

We have a team of Independent Sexual Violence Advisors (ISVAs) covering the whole of Cornwall and supporting men and women (aged 13 years and above).

The ISVAs lead a team of volunteers who are specially trained to listen to survivors of abuse. We believe you! Our role is not to investigate. Our role is to provide effective emotional support and practical help, and to support you to retake control of your life when you are ready to do so.

We will help you access other appropriate on-going support such as specialist counselling and if you choose to report to the police, we will support you every step of the way.

Authorised Listeners: Listening to survivors of abuse

If you are a victim or survivor of abuse (not necessarily proven or substantiated) from within the church community, you can seek a referral.

You can do so by contacting the Diocesan Safeguarding Officer (DSO) directly or indirectly through your Parish Priest or Safeguarding Co-ordinator

The DSO will speak to you to clarify the request.

The DSO will arrange for you to be contacted by an Authorised Listener (AL) within three weeks of the referral.

The AL will inform the DSO when the service is no longer required and of any 'next steps' you have agreed that the diocese needs to support.

You will be offered three sessions with an Authorised Listener. If additional needs are identified, further help will be provided.
