THOUSANDS JOIN BISHOP TIM AT ROYAL CORNWALL SHOW

The 223rd show took place in June and this year saw Bishop Tim take the role of Show President.



Despite a wet last day, this year's show looks set to be another record breaker in terms of attendance and among those exhibiting and visiting, were many from the Diocese.

The night before the gates first opened, the Annual Eve of Show Service again attracted a crowd.

The St Minver Silver Band and Pelynt Male Choir performed before this year's Show President, Bishop Tim commissioned the Show Chaplains.

Also present was Bishop Mark O'Toole from the Diocese of Plymouth, President of the Methodist Conference Rev Steven Wild and Chair of the Churches Together Tent Committee Rev Roger Greene.

Following the service, pasties and refreshments were served in the Churches Together Tent.

Then during the three days, volunteers were on hand to help out in the Churches Together Tent which this year was working under the theme of 'Sowing seeds across the Duchy'.

In the Weddings tent, the Weddings team were on hand to offer advice and information to those getting married this year.

The Chaplains were also in action across the showground providing chaplaincy and chat to anyone interested or in need.

QUEEN'S 90TH MARKED

Parishes across the diocese marked HRH The Queen's official 90th birthday in June and for many, the celebrations were a chance to bring their communities together.

In Tregony, the 'Royal Family' turned out in force to enjoy an afternoon of cake and tea at Tregony Community Primary School. Organised by St Cuby Church in Tregony, members of Tregony's Senior Citizen Club joined pupils from years four and five to enjoy a wide selection of cakes and to chat.

In Mawgan, the festivities began with a 'bring and share' tea party in the Recreation Hall.

MAJOR FUNDING BOOST FOR TWO CORNISH CHURCHES

Two churches in the diocese are to share in a £391,000 funding payout from the National Churches Trust.

A £10,000 grant will help to fund urgent and essential repairs to the roof, tower, and windows of St Mawgan-in-Meneage church and a further £10,000 will help fund urgent repairs to make St Neot church watertight.

“ Along with Archdeacon Audrey, I will be Following the Way on Saturday, July 30 and leading pilgrims from across Cornwall on a two mile walk from Laneast Church to St Clether Church and visiting the Holy Well of St Clether. It would be lovely to see as many of you as possible joining us for this day. ”

We will be starting with a short service at 10am at Laneast Church and all those taking part will be given a Pilgrim Badge before we head off.

If you don't feel you are able to walk or only able to give a short time, please don't be put off. There will be services in Laneast Church, the Holy Well Chapel and St Clether Church for people to join in and Pray the Way so do come and join in. Further Prayer Stations will be set up inside St Clether Church for those not walking on to the Holy Well Chapel. For those not able to walk the whole route, there will be opportunities to join in at various stages if you can only come for a short time.

At lunchtime there will be prayers at St

Clether before we share a meal together (pasties for those who order!). It will then be off to St Clether Holy Well Chapel where I will lead a simple Communion Service before we return to St Clether to enjoy some cream teas.

Archdeacon Audrey will lead the Evening Prayer to round the day off. We will be giving out pilgrimage bookmarks to all who take part at the end of the service.

And, it is not just me out walking this summer. On **July 23**, Bishop Chris will be walking from St Uny Church in Lelant to All Saints Church, Marazion as part of the Discipleship Year of Journeying OUT. Why not join in? There will be coffee and croissants available from 9am in St Uny before the walkers set off. Non walkers are again welcome to pray at both churches where prayer stations will be set up.

MISSION CASE STUDY

IT'S AS EASY AS ABC...MF

"Go, then, to all peoples everywhere and make them my disciples: baptize them in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, and teach them to obey everything I have commanded you. And I will be with you always to the end of the age".

Essentially that is what we are here for, as a Church, as witnesses to Christ we are here to make disciples: that is our mission as laid down in the Great Commission. Let's be honest though; it isn't always that easy. Everyday issues get in the way, everything costs money and more than that, everything takes time and nobody has enough time do they? Often we'd love to do missional work, to reach out to our communities and meet a need but we get way-laid by something else that needs doing.

The Archbishop's Council Mission Fund offers a catalyst for change. A small injection of cash to get your project off the ground. The aim is to provide additional resources for innovative parish working and encourage churches to try new things, preferably in partnership either with other churches or the local community.


It might help to set up Messy Church or an Open the Book Team, teach bell-ringing (Braddock Church's Mini ring is pictured right) or host a Heritage Fair. It could be a pack that helps you to communicate with



residents moving into new housing estates or you might wish to create a community or sensory garden. Perhaps you want to hold a tea dance or have a celebratory event for the Queen's 90th Birthday celebrations. Maybe there is a need to set up a Foodbank in your local area. We're relying on you bringing the inspiration for the project and we can help with meeting the costs.

LIFE CHANGING OR LIFE SAPPING?



James Hills' is a husband, dad, optimistic Spurs fan, lover of food and people in the church family and parish of St Kea where is Assistant Curate. He was priested in the 2015 and is now reflecting on the last 12 months.

I was priested last Pentecost after only 50 minutes sleep, due to our daughter appearing in the world at 4am on the morning of my ordination. For many of my colleagues this was the culmination of much hard work that now finally they were a priest.

For me though not a lot had changed. Don't get me wrong, to be prayed for by our Bishops & others was huge. But it hadn't changed me, I was still James, still a sinner saved by God's grace, still struggling to be godly, still learning what it means to lead a local Anglican church. And this isn't just the sleeplessness talking.

But what did hit me & what I reflect on again and again are the promises I made at both my deaconing and at my priesting to serve the people to whom I have been sent: to teach faithfully the Word of the Lord, to diligently pray, to proclaim the gospel in every place, to fashion my own life to the way of Christ.

The way of ordained ministry is servanthood, just like the Christian life

(Mark 8:34, 10:45). It isn't about having new powers or finally being recognised, its about walking closer in the footsteps of Christ and laying our lives down for the sake of others. Ordained ministry is life sapping. Its echoing John the Baptist words, "He [Jesus] must become greater, I must become less" (John 3:30).

Yet as I do that I have discovered Jesus' counter-cultural logic, as we expend ourselves for others, we know huge blessing. Now thats a privilege and one I thank the Lord for daily as I serve him in ministry.
